Dear Impact Latin America Partners,

Thank you for your prayers, generosity, and partnership in our vision to plant God's peace in individuals, homes, and communities throughout Latin America. We do this by engaging partners like you to equip Latin American leaders to foster a movement that multiplies disciples, leaders, and churches.

This year 1,544 active Houses of Peace have gathered regularly across the region. Through these Houses of Peace, 13,640 people are being discipled. They in turn share their faith stories with other people in their circle of influence, some of whom will also become disciples. God is moving through ordinary people - women and men, youth and elderly, from all walks of life - who respond to His call to be disciples who make disciples opening their homes as Houses of Peace.

Prayer and commitment are two of the factors that make this movement sustainable. Planned intercessory prayer, individually and in small and large groups, and commitment to consistently pray for and mentor emerging and experienced leaders alike who then equip others are key ingredients to the success of Impact Latin America.

Planting Houses of Peace

Your prayers and support directly impacts 1608 thriving house churches in homes and communities in 20 countries. Through these regular gatherings, over 13,000 new believers are being discipled and equipped to share the good news with others.



“When I first started at Foursquare Christian Church in Coveñas, I heard about Impact Latin America’s community church planting (CCP), although I didn’t fully understand it.

Later, I received training called Disciples Making Disciples. Luz, a fellow church member, tasked with implementing the model in our church invited me to accompany her to her House of Peace.

Impact Latin America stewards a movement to plant God's peace by equipping leaders who equip leaders. Since 2020 over 15,000 individuals from interested churches and denominations have participated in our Disciples Making Disciples training equipping them to reach their communities.

Over 1500 House of Peace planters, network coordinators and training facilitators - all volunteers - are actively resourced in their roles to reach their individual potential and to serve their teams well.

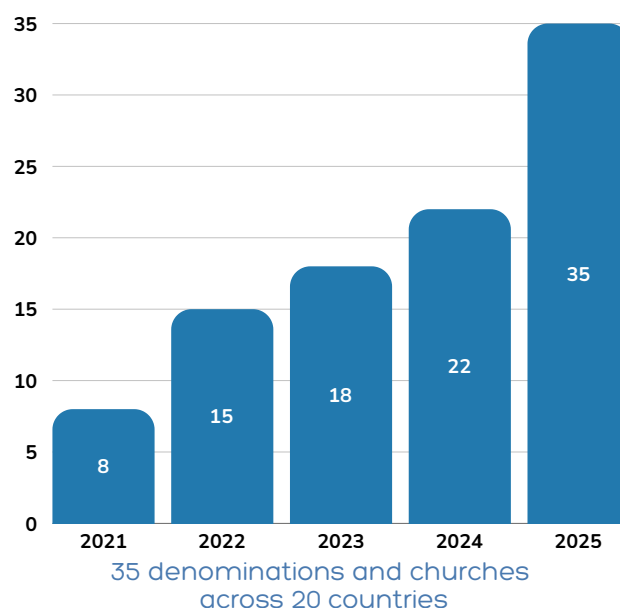

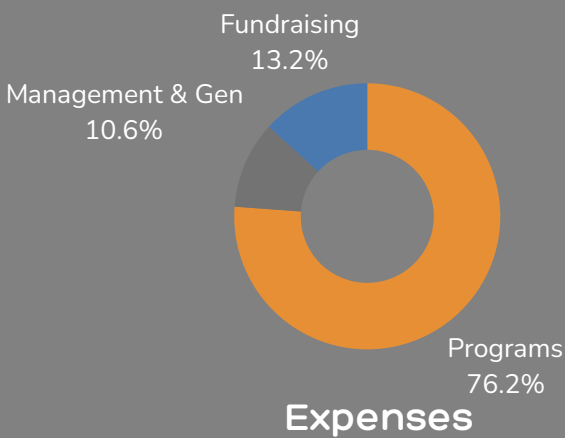
